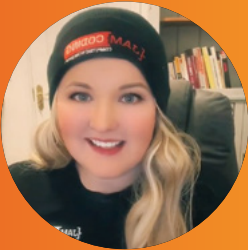




Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs) mean high quality recruits for the digital sector
